MEMORIES OF GRETA FRANKLIN

Greta Franklin bought her first Bolognese from me over 15 years ago but I already knew her from her well known Starexpress Maltese, who were always presented to perfection. She had great success with Maltese making up champions and was well known for her smart presentation, both herself and her dogs.



I knew she would present the Bolognese in the correct way and would be an ambassador for the breed as she was a regular exhibitor. She had great success with the breed and brought them to the attention of many judges who might have thought they were untidy, untrimmed little white dogs!!. They thought differently when they saw them in the Group ring.

She joined the committee of the British Bolognese Club and was a great help with the information posters that were on the stand at Discover Dogs. She also did a lot of articles especially for new owners and exhibitors on grooming and healthcare that appeared in the Bolognese newsletter, and still appear on the website.





She judged the breed at Crufts in 2015 when there were a number of overseas exhibitors and her BOB was from the Netherlands. She was due to judge Maltese at Crufts the month before she died but pulled out as she knew she would not be strong enough.

Like her dogs she was always well presented and was a person who was not afraid to voice her opinions but was always open to discussion.

Her cancer was something she fought hard and tried all the options open to her after long discussions with her oncologists.

The new drug she was trying and had great faith in alas, was not to be the answer after all and after being told it was not working, she came home to end of life care so she could be with Judd and her family. She died on Easter Sunday peacefully with her family around her.

Her funeral was held at her local church where there was a very good turnout of family, friends and neighbours including her many grandchildren. Her husband Judd told me that there were still 2 Bolognese at home and he had promised Greta they would always be his companions.

Our condolences to the family from all at the British Bolognese Club, she will be missed.

Open shows

There seems to be a flurry of open shows during this quarter. It is unusual for us to have classes at so many. On the whole they appear to have been well supported. These open shows really make a difference for the points for our DOTY Shield.

South Eastern Toy which was sponsored by BBC this year has classes for most toy dogs and many well known exhibitors attend so feels very much like a championship show Our judge was Dr lan Gabriel. The last time I came across him was when he judged the puppy group at Southern Counties in 2022.
